



Breakfast and departure to Toledo, known as the **City of Three Cultures** for preserving important traces of the history of the three monotheistic religions that inhabited the area for centuries.

We will admire the facade of this imposing religious temple and learn about its history.

Day 6. BARCELONA MODERNISTA

Breakfast and start of our tour in **Plaza de Cataluña**, in the heart of the city, to begin this tour of modernist Barcelona.

The first stop will be the so-called Apple of Discord.

Day 2. BARCELONA - VALENCIA

Breakfast at the hotel.

Departure to **Valencia** by bus. Guided visit to the **Cathedral** of Valencia with its mixture of Gothic and Baroque styles and the **Barrio del Carmen**, bohemian and artistic.

Lunch and then visit of the **City of Arts and Sciences**, a futuristic architectural complex.

Dinner and overnight in Valencia.

Day 3. VALENCIA - GRANADA

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure to Granada by bus. After lunch, visit the Arab palaces and gardens of the Alhambra and the Generalife, the Cathedral of Granada and the Albaicin, a medieval Arab quarter, with panoramic views and example of the Spanish Renaissance, now converted into a bohemian center of writers and artists. Dinner and overnight in Granada.

Day 4. GRANADA - MÁLAGA

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure to Malaga by coach.

Upon arrival, guided tour to visit the imposing Alcazaba and Gibralfaro Castle with its panoramic views, stroll through the charming historic center and visit the Picasso Museum. Traditional lunch in a typical Malaga restaurant before continuing with the entrance to the majestic Cathedral of Malaga, known as "La Manquita". Dinner and overnight in Malaga.

Day 5. MÁLAGA - RONDA - SEVILLA

Breakfast and departure to Ronda.

Upon arrival, guided visit to the **New Bridge**, **icon of the city over the Tagus**; its Bullring, the oldest in Spain and the picturesque Old Town with a **labyrinth of historic streets**.

Lunch and then continue to Seville. Dinner and overnight in Seville.

Day 6. SEVILLA

Breakfast and full day in Seville. Guided tour of the imposing **Cathedral and the Giralda**, symbols of the city and the exquisite Real Alcazar, Mudejar style palace.

Stop for lunch and then tour of the **Maria Luisa Park** with its majestic **Plaza de España**, an architectural work of the twentieth century. Dinner and overnight.

Day 7. SEVILLA - CÓRDOBA

Breakfast and transfer to Cordoba. Guided tour of the impressive Mosque-Cathedral, an architectural marvel combining Islamic and Christian elements; the historic Alcazar de los Reyes Cristianos, a palace with beautiful gardens and panoramic views; and the emblematic Roman Bridge over the Guadalquivir River with breathtaking views.

Lunch and free afternoon to stroll through the charming **Jewish quarter**, exploring its narrow streets and flower-filled courtyards or visit the **Plaza de la Corredera**, a lively place full of cafes and stores. Dinner and overnight in **Cordoba**.

Day 8. CÓRDOBA - MADRID

Breakfast and departure to Madrid.

Upon arrival, lunch at the hotel. In the afternoon guided tour of the lively Plaza Mayor, the emblematic Puerta del Sol, Spain's kilometer zero, the Royal Palace, official residence of the Spanish Royal Family, the prestigious Prado Museum and the Retiro Park, ideal for strolling, paddling in the pond and visiting the Crystal Palace. Overnight in Madrid.


Day 9. DEPARTURE TO MADRID.

Breakfast and transfer to the airport for return to your home country.

An essential part of the Spanish wine identity are the so-called **Protected Designations of Origin (PDO)** of wine, a fundamental system that guarantees the quality, authenticity and origin of the wines produced in different regions of the country.



Wine Route from Madrid

6nights

Day 1. MADRID

From Madrid we will start a great wine route to **Navalcarnero to visit its Wine Museum**, an old winery of the XIX century, restored to open its doors in 2002. At the end of the visit we will go to San Martín de Valdeiglesias.

Visit the vineyard where they will explain the varieties on the work of viticulture and the peculiarities of the cultivation of the wine. Then we will go to the elaboration room where we will explain the fermentation process, the differences between the elaboration of a white and a red wine, young red wine, crianza... to finish with a wine tasting including appetizers.

At the end of the visit we will go to a typical restaurant in the area for lunch. At the end of the tour we will return to Madrid.

Day 2. MADRID - ARANDA DEL DUERO

Departure to Aranda del Duero. Visit of the city. We will go to a **typical restaurant**, where we will visit its own winery and taste wines from the area. At the end of the visit we will go upstairs to have lunch, typical dishes of the area. At the end we will go to La VID. Accommodation.

Day 3. LA VID - LERMA - BURGOS

Breakfast at the hotel. Visit to the **vineyards** and later to the wineries.

We will finish with a **wine tasting**. We will head to Burgos for lunch. During our tour we will make a brief stop in Lerma, visit. Arrival in Burgos. Lunch and accommodation.

Day 4. BURGOS - NÁJERA

Breakfast at the hotel. Morning city tour of Burgos. We will visit the places of interest.

Continue to Nájera. Arrival and accommodation.

Day 5. NÁJERA - HARO - BRIONES -LOGROÑO

Breakfast at the hotel. We will make a **tour from Nájera to Logroño**.

During our tour we will make different stops in the most emblematic villages of La Rioja.

We will have the opportunity to visit different wineries, where wine making is still done in the traditional way with the treading of the grapes, thus obtaining a young wine with a spectacular taste, if we are in season, we will have the opportunity to see how the treading of the grapes is done and also try it ourselves. Arrival in Logroño.

Day 6. LOGROÑO - SANTO DOMINGO DE LA CALZADA

Breakfast at the hotel. City tour, we will walk around the places of interest in **Logroño**.

You will have free time to get to know this beautiful city at your own pace. Then we will go to **Santo Domingo de la Calzada**. Arrival and we will have lunch at a well-known restaurant, typical for its gastronomy. At the end we will go to the **Parador** de Santo Domingo de la Calzada. Rest of the afternoon free to stroll around this beautiful city.

Day 7. SANTO DOMINGO DE LA CALZADA - MADRID

Breakfast at the hotel. At the scheduled time, our assistant will be waiting for you at the reception of the Parador, for our return to Madrid. Arrival in Madrid.

Gastronomic delights from North of Spain

8nights

Day 1. ORIGIN - BARCELONA

Welcome to Spain. Your adventure begins in the charming city of **Barcelona**.

Assistance by our staff and transfer to your hotel for check in. Depending on your arrival time, you will explore the streets of the old Gothic Quarter, visit the Picasso Museum, stroll along the famous Ramblas.

During the tour we will taste locally produced cava or vermouth in a local bar and then, following a tapas route, tasting rustic, bite-sized Catalan dishes. Accommodation.

Day 2. BARCELONA - LOGROÑO

Breakfast, check out and departure east to the prized vineyards of the wine region of La Rioja and Logroño. Logroño sits on the banks of the Ebro River and is the capital of Spain's most renowned wine region. It also boasts one of the country's most distinguished culinary traditions and is home to some of the best tapas bars in all of Spain, all squeezed into its small medieval center. Logroño is a charming town of medieval fortifications, where much work is being done to restore it to its full splendor.

This afternoon you will take a walking tour of the **Old Town**, strolling along Calle del Laurel and the 60 or so taperías (tapas bars) that line it.

It's the perfect **opportunity to try a bit of everything**, as each bar has its own specialty: sample grilled chorizo or wild mushrooms, and wash it all down with a glass of the region's famous red wine.

Accommodation.

Day 3. LOGROÑO - SAN SEBASTIÁN

Breakfast and departure to San Sebastian stopping at the historic walled town of **Laguardia**, perched on a rock foundation.

The entire center of Laguardia is free of traffic, as underground lies a labyrinth of tunnels, used to make and store wine for centuries.

Here you will tour the wine caves of Laguardia and then enjoy a guided tasting of some of the different varietals of the region. In the afternoon, transfer to stunning coastal San Sebastian, jewel of the Basque Country and food-obsessed city.

We will take an orientation tour of the **Parte Vieja**, a mix of narrow streets squeezed between the bay and the Urumea River.

Neighborhood streets for a **txikiteo de pintxos**, a Basque-style tapas route that will fill your senses - and your stomach - with the unique flavors of the region. **Don't forget to wash them down with txakoli**, a **lightly sparkling white wine that is the hallmark of the region**. Accommodation.

Day 4. SAN SEBASTIÁN

Breakfast and departure to discover one of the secrets of the success of **San Sebastian's gastronomic scene**, the obsession with local, seasonal and **high quality ingredients**.

The best way to experience this first hand is to visit the traditional markets of La Bretxa or San Martin, and that is precisely what you will do this morning before a Basque cooking masterclass. In this hands-on cooking class, you'll learn how to prepare some of the region's signature dishes, and you'll also taste Basque products such as Idiazabal - a local cheese - and txakoli - a lightly sparkling dry white wine. The afternoon is free for you

to explore more of the city or its surroundings. Perhaps take a cable car up **Mount Igueldo** for some truly spectacular views or stroll along the winding coastline to the nearby fishing village of **Getaria**.

Perhaps discover the beaches, stores and charismatic streets of San Sebastian, or dive into **pintxo bars** that range from the traditional to the experimental.

Accommodation

Day 5. SAN SEBASTIÁN — BILBAO — PARQUE NACIONAL DE LOS PICOS DE EUROPA

Breakfast and departure east to Bilbao, a city revitalized by the arrival of the **Guggenheim Museum**.

Spend some free time visiting Frank Gehry's imposing metal building and the art treasures inside and out, then take a bus up to the Picos de Europa National Park. The park is not what many people imagine Spain to be: it's an alpine landscape, high, cool, lush and green, with forests, deep gorges through the cliffs and meadows dotted with photogenic caramel-colored cows.

At some 647 square kilometers, Picos de Europa is the second largest national park in Spain and spans the three provinces of Asturias, Cantabria and Leon. For dinner, we have a classic Cantabrian dish on the menu: Cocido Lebaniego, a rich and hearty stew of black pudding, pork shoulder, chorizo sausage and chickpeas grown in the area.

Preparation of this dish begins the day before, so while you savor this rich and satisfying local delicacy, take a moment to learn about the ingredients and preparation. Be sure to enjoy it with some crusty bread and a glass of cider.

Day 6. PARQUE NACIONAL DE LOS PICOS DE EUROPA — OVIEDO

Breakfast and this morning you will have the

option of heading into the National Park, where you can take a walk or ride the funicular up into the mountains for spectacular views of the surrounding valleys.

Afterwards, head to the small mountain town of Potes, nestled in the National Park. Bordered by **ancient monasteries, Potes is steeped in centuries of history**, and is a picturesque tapestry of bridges, narrow streets and old houses. You'll arrive in time for the wonderful weekly food market, where you'll enjoy a market brunch.

Depending on the season, you can savor locally grown apples, cherries, tomatoes, olives, asparagus or nuts. On the way to Oviedo, the ancient capital of the region, drive to the charming hillside village of Arenas de Cabrales.

Here you will have the opportunity to taste the famous Cabrales cheese, a **natural blue cheese produced by farmers** following a traditional artisanal method.

Upon arrival in Oviedo, stop at an **Asturian** cider house, the traditional drink of the region.

Enjoy a glass in the local style, poured from a bottle held high above the head into a knee-high glass to produce a natural carbonation. Enjoy an afternoon at leisure to savor any local delicacies that tempt you.

Accommodation

Day 7. OVIEDO

Breakfast and departure to stroll through the beautiful city of Oviedo, with its unique personality, its picturesque pre-Romanesque churches, its elegant narrow streets, its beautiful monuments and its grandiose houses. In the heart of the city is the impressive Gothic Cathedral of San Salvador.

You will also enjoy an introduction to the

wonderful local produce of Asturias at El Fontan market, which houses excellent fish stalls under a wrought iron and glass canopy.

This afternoon will be free for you to explore the city on your own.

Perhaps take a trip to the **port city of Gijón for fresh seafood and bakeries full of sweets,** or to the fishing village of Luanco for a relaxing drink on the waterfront.

For dinner, consider heading to **Gascona Street**, lined with lively cider houses serving a wide range of raciones (tasting plates).

Accommodation

Day 8. OVIEDO - LA CORUÑA - SANTIAGO

Breakfast and departure to A Coruña, in the region of Galicia, taking in some of the spectacular **Galician coastline** along the way.

Here you will visit the impressive **Praza de Lugo** fish market and marvel at the variety of seafood on offer. Have a **fresh seafood lunch at a nearby café**, with other delicious non-seafood options available.

Then, like thousands of pilgrims before you, end your journey in the capital of Galicia, believed to be the final resting place of the apostle St. James.

The beautiful old city of Santiago de Compostela holds many charms within its walls, all presided over by the mighty cathedral. Stroll through the night-lit old town, the arcaded stone streets, the spacious Praza del Obradoiro and the imposing archbishop's palace.

Santiago is not only home to pilgrims, as the large student population at the university boosts the city's nightlife. Perhaps spend the evening in one of the cafes, bars or tapas restaurants in the old town.

ROUTE of the ACORN BERIAN HAM

4nights

The Iberian ham is considered a gastronomic jewel and Spain has four denominations of origin (D.O) and can know first hand 3 of them, to learn about the truth of the authentic Iberian acorn ham.

How to differentiate it from the rest and know all its thorough elaboration process, from the essential food of the pigs in the pasture.



Day 1. ARRIVAL AT THE AIRPORT O TRAIN STATION OF SEVILLA - ARACENA

Welcome to the Andalusian capital. You will find your **Sevillian guide** who will show you the wonders of this city. We can admire the majestic **cathedral**, **the Giralda and the Alcazar** and know its history and culture. We will enjoy a tapas route with bars of great charm to taste the Andalusian specialties.

Departure to **Aracena** (approx. 1h 15m). Visit to the wonders grotto. Many millions of years, 570 no less, for marbles to emerge and take such peculiar forms. **Walking through this grotto is like getting into a time tunnel Simple wonderful.**

Arrival to the hotel, check in and accommodation.

Day 2. ARACENA - ZAFRA

Breakfast and start the day enjoying a great gastronomic day. During the morning, visit to **organic cheese farm**, where you will learn about the production process, make your own cheese and chat **6 different types of cheese with wine**. Visit to Iberian ham dryer of the D.O.

From Huelva (shortly from Jabugo), great tasting, we will see the process of elaboration and visit the pasture where they raise the Iberian pigs in freedom.

Trip to **Zafra** (1 h.) 18:15 Visit to prestigious winery. Tasting of your wines. Check in in charming hotel. Free time.

Day 3. ZAFRA – MÉRIDA – CÁCERES

Breakfast and start of the day with a visit to the 2nd Iberian dryer D.O Extremadura with tasting. We will continue with a trip to the spectacular Cornalvo natural park (approx. 1 hour) to visit the deer and black merino sheep farm. An unforgettable experience with its owners, which will end with a meal in a typical Andalusian farmhouse or restaurant in Mérida owned by the same owner (depending on group size).

We will visit Mérida, impressive Roman archaeological set declared a World Heritage Site. Journey to Cáceres (1 h approx.)

Check in in charming hotel. Free time.

Day 4. CÁCERES - GUIJUELO - SALAMANCA

Breakfast and start the day with a departure to **Guijuelo** (1.30h). From 11:00-14:00 visit to the 3rd Iberian winery D.O Guijuelo with a great tasting (lunch). Departure to **Salamanca** (45min.)

Guided tour of the university city par excellence, the place where the first grammar of Castilian was born, a monumental complex of great beauty declared a World Heritage Site. We will visit the grand and baroque Plaza Mayor, the Casa de las Conchas (with more than 300 shells on its façade), its renowned University, the oldest in Spain and its grand Cathedral.

Transfer to the winery on the banks of the Douro River. Visit with tasting. Return to Salamanca. Check in. Free time.

Day 5. SALAMANCA - SEGOVIA

Breakfast and onward journey to **Segovia**. Guided tour of the old city and Roman aqueduct, which are World Heritage Sites.

In addition to the famous aqueduct, a multitude of Romanesque churches, the Cathedral and the Alcázar make up a majestic landscape that dominates these Castilian lands.

Lunch at a prestigious grill restaurant with a typical roast suckling pig dish. Transfer to the airport or hotel in Madrid. End of service or possible extensions.

ROUTE OF THE ANDALUSIAN LEGACY

7nights

From north to south and from east to west. In every corner of Spain you will find a Parador for you. Castles where you can feel like a king, cloisters that invite you to relax and avant-garde refuges in the middle of the most amazing natural landscapes. Beach or mountain, inland or coast.

Live an unforgettable experience in Paradores.

Day 1. PARADOR DE MÁLAGA GIBRALFARO

Seven long centuries of Arab influence have left a deep mark on the vast territory baptised in the Middle Ages as Al-Andalus. The route starts on the Mediterranean coast. Málaga was Arab and its Alcazaba is a beautiful example of that legacy. It was the palace of the Nasrid kings and today is home to the Provincial Archaeological Museum. Other places of interest are the Cathedral, the Cathedral Museum and the Sanctuary of the Virgen de la Victoria. It is interesting to visit the Museum of Fine Arts and the birthplace and the Picasso Museum, where you will discover more than 230 works by the painter.

The capital of Málaga is a perfect place to enjoy sport - you can take advantage of the opportunity to visit the neighbouring Parador de Málaga to play a few holes on its renowned course - the sun, the white sand beaches and the nightlife in the coastal towns. And there are few pleasures like those offered by tasting the exquisite grilled fish skewers.

Day 2. PARADOR DE RONDA

We enter the interior of Malaga. The romantic Ronda awaits us, the cradle of bullfighting dynasties and bandits. A town of immense beauty. In each of its streets we will perceive the Arab heritage, since Izn-Rand Onda, which means "City of the Castle", was one of the capitals of Muslim Spain, leaving us monuments such as the Arab Baths, the Old Bridge, the House of the Giant and the House of Mondragón. But there is also a Ronda with

Cavalry Maestranza, one of the oldest and most monumental in Spain and where the Goyesca Bullfight is held annually, or the imposing New Bridge, built in an impressive enclave to cross a 120-meter deep cliff and next to which the parador is located, with unique views over the Tagus.

The natural surroundings of Ronda are no less beautiful than the city, surrounded by the Natural Parks of Sierra de la Grazalema, Sierra de las Nieves and Los Alcornocales.

Also worth a place on the agenda is Reservatauro, a theme park of the Mediterranean pasture, the fighting bull and the purebred Spanish horse, unique in the world; and you can discover how olive oil is extracted in a traditional olive mill or visit one of the more than 20 wineries in the D.O. Sierras de Málaga/Serranía de Ronda.

Days 3 and 4. PARADOR DE ANTEQUERA

The next stop is in **Antequera**. Due to its privileged geographical location, several civilizations have passed through, leaving an interesting cultural legacy.

One of the most important monuments is the Dolmen Complex of Menga, Viera and El Romeral, which dates back to the Bronze Age. Walking through its historic center is like traveling back in time. It is interesting to visit the churches of San Juan Bautista and San Sebastián or to see its Alcazaba. Also noteworthy are the Templete del Castillo del Papabellotas and the 17th and 18th century

palaces. All of them are characterized by their impressive Spanish Baroque style. In the central area you can see the Royal Collegiate Church of San Sebastián, which dates back to the 16th century. Don't hesitate to visit the Convent of the Encarnación and then visit the Plaza del Coso Viejo, a beautiful bullring near the convent. To regain strength from this tour, we recommend trying one of the local specialties: porra antequerana, a cold and thick tomato cream, a cousin of gazpacho.

Just over 30 kilometres north of the province, in the Los Ardales Natural Park, you will find the spectacular Caminito del Rey trail, a via ferrata previously known as one of the most dangerous in the world, but now absolutely safe to walk on. Keep an eye out for the splendid view of the El Chorro gorge, where the Guadalhorce River flows at a height of more than 100 metres. Another must-see just half an hour away is the unique karst landscape of El Torcal, with its amazing rock formations, chasms and caves.

Day 5. PARADOR DE CARMONA

A good example of the Arab influence can be found in the Sevillian town of Carmona. Located on the Corbones river plain, it is a city that stands out for its monumentality and for the legacy of the different cultures that have populated it. Churches, palaces and walls form part of the important artistic heritage housed in its historic centre, dominated by the imposing image of its fortress of Arab origin, the Alcázar del Rey Don Pedro.

A visit to the Puerta de Sevilla, the Roman necropolis, testimony to a splendid past, the Mudejar neighbourhood of San Felipe, the intricate Jewish quarter and the City Museum, which allows you to trace its history, is a must. Its location, half an hour by car from Seville, allows you to enjoy the vast monumental and artistic heritage of the Andalusian capital, such as the Royal Alcazar, which Abd al-Rhaman III began to

build in 913. Also of interest are the Cathedral, the **Giralda**, **the Torre del Oro**, as well as the numerous leisure possibilities offered by the Sevillian capital.

The Arabic influence can also be perceived in the desserts and the pastries follow a long convent tradition. The most notable are the English cake, the olive oil buns, rice pudding, French toast soaked in sweet wine and honey, homemade polvorones, almond cakes and the tasty chestnut stew with cinnamon. Irresistible!

Days 6 and 7. PARADOR DE CÓRDOBA

Heading towards Córdoba, halfway we come across Écija, in the Genil valley, considered one of the most important artistic centres in Andalusia. We continue on our way to our destination: Córdoba, the legendary city of the Caliphs that was the dream come true of Abd-al Rahman I, capital of the Umayyad Caliphate and centre of Western wisdom during that period. A World Heritage City, its Mosque with its colossal prayer hall with almost a thousand columns joined by horseshoe arches – is the most important monument in the entire Islamic West, and one of the most amazing in the world.

It is worth getting lost in the beautiful corners of one of the most complex and rich urban networks, with spaces full of charm and sensuality and letting yourself be surprised by the emblematic courtyards, with their colourful floral explosion. And don't forget to treat yourself to a good meal of salmorejo cordobés and a delicious oxtail stew.

Also worth mentioning are the Synagogue, the city walls, the Roman bridge, the royal stables... or such interesting museums as the Julio Romero de Torres Museum, the Archaeological Museum, the Bullfighting Museum or the Museum of Fine Arts.
